Holiday Safety Tips & Updates

Police Department Holiday Tips:

- Do your holiday shopping with a friend and be mindful of your surroundings when going to and from your car.
- Do not leave gifts or valuables inside vehicles, bring them inside your house.
- Once gifts are open don't leave boxes on the curb. An empty television box on the curb tells a burglar there is a new television inside the house. Break down boxes and place them in the trash.
- If you are leaving town for the holidays complete a House Watch form at the Police Department Headquarters on West Broad Street or online at www.fairburn.com. The department recommends completing the form 7 days in advance.

Fire Department Seasonal Tips

Burn permits are issued daily based on weather conditions. Residents of Fairburn who would like to burn yard debris such as leaf piles and small limb piles should contact the Georgia Forestry Commission at www.gfc.state.ga.us or by calling 1-877-OK2-BURN.

Daylight savings time ends Sunday November 2. Please remember to change the batteries in your smoke detectors and set your clocks back an hour.

The winter months bring many challenges for our Fire Department. People use many methods to stay warm including wood burning stoves, space heaters, and fireplaces. These methods are often contributing factors to residential structure fires. Many of these fires can be prevented.

- Be sure that heaters are in good working condition. Fuel burning appliances should be properly vented as they can produce deadly fumes.
- Fireplace chimneys should be inspected annually and cleaned. Keep flammable materials away from fireplaces and wood burning stoves. Never discard hot ashes from a fireplace or wood burning stove inside or near the home. Place them in a metal container outside and well away from the house.
- Never use a range or oven as a supplemental heating device as they can be a source of potentially toxic fumes.
