

Protect Yourself and Your Family Today!

In the event of a fire, properly installed and maintained smoke alarms will provide an early warning alarm to your household. This alarm could save your own life and those of your loved ones by providing the chance to escape.

About 3,500 Americans die each year in fires and about 18,300 are injured. Many of them might be alive today if they had only learned what to do if there is a fire. It is very important to have a working smoke alarm

with a working battery in your home. An alarm greatly lowers your chances of dying in a fire.

The Fairburn Fire Department is offering free smoke alarms to the residences in Fairburn. The program is on a first come first served basis, as supplies last. Project S.A.F.E. is designed to reduce fire related injuries and deaths by installing smoke alarms homes *FREE OF CHARGE*. The program is made possible by donation of smoke alarms to the Fire Department.

Alarms will be installed by City of Fairburn Fire Personnel.

The SAFE Program reminds everyone to:

Have working smoke alarms on every level of your home and outside all sleeping areas; Test every alarm monthly; and have and practice a home fire escape plan with all members of your family.

Payment of Property Taxes: All taxes remaining unpaid after the due date of December 15 are considered delinquent and are subject to interest charges. A ten percent (10%) tax penalty accrues ninety (90) days after the due date. Additional fees and cost accrue as collection actions are taken.

1% interest is added on January 1 and each month thereafter until paid.

A 10% penalty is added on March 16 which is 90 days after the due date of December 15.

Collections fees are charged as they are incurred.

Tax liens are sold on the first Tuesday in September of each year. The location of the sale is the Council Chambers in the Fairburn City Hall.

Occupational Tax Renewal Invoices have been mailed out and are due - March 31, 2016 all payments not renewed will become delinquent on April 1, 2016. **The penalty for payment received after April 1, 2016 is 10% of the tax due. Interest for payments received after April 1, 2016 is 1.5% of the total amount due per month.**
