Preparing for the Holidays

Fire Dept. Holiday Tips:

Burn permits are issued daily based on weather conditions. Residents of Fairburn who would like to burn yard debris such as leaf piles and small limb piles should contact the Georgia Forestry Commission at www.gfc.state.ga.us or by calling 1-877-OK2-BURN.

Daylight savings time ends Sunday, November 1. Please remember to change the batteries in your smoke detectors.

The winter months bring many challenges for our Fire Department. People use many methods to stay warm including wood burning stoves, space heaters, and fireplaces. These methods are often contributing factors to residential structure fires. Many of these fires can be prevented.

- Be sure that heaters are in good working condition. Fuel burning appliances should be properly

vented as they can produce deadly fumes.

- Fireplace chimneys should be inspected annually and cleaned. Keep flammable materials away from fireplaces and wood burning stoves. Never discard hot ashes from a fireplace or wood burning stove inside or near the home. Place them in a metal container outside and well away from the house.
- Never use a range or over as a supplemental heating device as they can be a source of potentially toxic fumes.

as many deaths and injuries happen each year due to turkey fryer fires. Before you set up your turkey fryer this Thanksgiving, remember these safety tips.

- **Stay Away from The House** – Set up the turkey fryer more than 10 feet away from your home and keep children and pets away. Never leave it unattended.
- **Find Flat Ground** – The oil must be even and steady at all times to ensure safety. Place the fryer on a flat, level surface and carefully gauge the amount of oil needed.
- **Use a Thawed and Dry Turkey** – Make sure your Thanksgiving turkey is completely thawed and dry. Extra water will cause the oil to bubble furiously and spill over. If oil spills from the fryer onto the burner, it can cause a fire.
- **Monitor the Temp** – Use caution when touching the turkey fryer. The lid and handle can become very hot and could cause burns. Also be sure to keep track of the oil's temperature as many fryers do not have their own thermostats.
- **Be Prepared** – Have a fire extinguisher (multipurpose, dry-powder) ready at all times in the event that the oil ignites.
