Re: Parking Enforcement on U.S. HWY 29 Overlay District

The purpose of this notice is to notify the businesses in the City of Fairburn's U.S. Highway 29 Overlay District of upcoming enforcement efforts by the City of Fairburn. These efforts are not due to a change in law or in policy but to a change in priority. There are currently signs located on West Broad Street/US 29/SR 14, West Campbellton Street/SR 92, and Smith Street respectively, which restrict parking to two (2) hour increments. These time limitations have not been enforced in the past, but that is about to change. Long term parking in areas designated to have parking limitations is adversely affecting the patronage of businesses in the area. As such, additional signage that clearly illustrate the two (2) hour parking limitation will be installed in the next couple of weeks. After which time, the City of Fairburn's Police Department will initiate enforcement activities to ensure full compliance with Sec. 56-23 of the City of Fairburn's Code of Ordinances. These measures may include but are not limited to the issuance of citations/tickets and the impounding of vehicles.

This courtesy notification is being provided by the City of Fairburn in an effort to provide businesses that may be currently operating illegally, the opportunity to make the necessary arrangements to bring their activities into compliance. Public parking is available at the Train Depot parking lot located at 70 W. Broad Street and the Fairburn Municipal Building parking lot located at 26 W.
