Fire Department Seasonal Tips

Burn permits are issued daily based on weather conditions. Residents of Fairburn who would like to burn yard debris such as leaf piles and small limb piles should contact the Georgia Forestry Commission at www.gfc.state.ga.us or by calling 1-877-OK2-BURN.

Daylight savings time ends Sunday November 3. Please remember to change the batteries in your smoke detectors.

The winter months bring many challenges for our Fire Department. People use many methods to stay warm including wood burning stoves, space heaters, and fireplaces. These methods are often contributing factors to residential structure fires. Many of these fires can be prevented.

- Be sure that heaters are in good working condition. Fuel burning appliances should be properly vented as they can produce deadly fumes.
- Fireplace chimneys should be inspected annually and cleaned. Keep flammable materials away from fireplaces and wood burning stoves. Never discard hot ashes from a fireplace or wood burning stove inside or near the home. Place them in a metal container outside and well away from the house.
- Never use a range or over as a supplemental heating device as they can be a source of potentially toxic fumes.

Tune Up for the Winter Heating Season

As cooler weather approaches, there are several things you can do to stay warm while helping to control your utility bill. Whether your heating is fueled by electricity or natural gas, keep these tips in mind:

- Set your thermostat for 68 degrees when you are home. Each degree above 68 will result in a 10 percent increase in energy usage.
- When the home will be unoccupied for a long period of time, lower the thermostat to conserve energy, or install a programmable thermostat to automate your settings.
- Replace air system filters regularly. A dirty filter makes the system run longer, increasing energy usage.
- Reverse ceiling fan direction to circulate the warm air throughout the home.

- If you are using space heaters to supplement your home heating system, remember to keep them at least three feet away from drapes, furniture and other flammable materials.
- Close the damper in the fireplace when not in use to prevent warm air from escaping up the chimney.
