
Key Accomplishments & Initatives

The Fire Chief attended a meeting with Fire Chiefs from the surrounding South Fulton area to further discuss Grady Hospital's transition to self-dispatching its ambulances. As indicated in the previous Monthly Report, under the new process, 911 calls will first be routed to the local emergency dispatch center, which will then notify Grady. Grady will subsequently dispatch its own ambulances directly. This effort aims to improve response efficiency though coordination between agencies will remain essential to ensure seamless service to the public.

Training Division

During the month of August, the Training Division engaged in several key initiatives to support regional collaboration and professional development. These included:

- 1. Participation in the City of South Fulton Fire Department Promotional Assessment.





The plan establishes a long-term vision for the city's growth, land use, housing, transportation, and economic development. It will be formally presented to the Mayor and City Council on September 8, 2025, which will officially launch the public review and comment process. Community members will be encouraged to provide feedback through public hearings, workshops, and written comments.
- The Planning and Zoning Commission will hold its next meeting on September 2, 2025.
- The Planning Staff are actively working on drafting updates to the city's regulations, including revisions to property maintenance standards and adjustments to align with the recent Zoning Procedures Law changes.

- The Highway 29 power pole and wire replacement project is complete. This will improve the load capacity for this side of Fairburn to the Highway 29/138 Gateway area.
- The Rivertown Road Overhead to Underground infrastructure project has progressed from Colony Trail to the Water Boy Mary Erna Streets entrance with the underground conduit installation. The wire conductor is currently being installed in the underground conduit. The contractors are on schedule for the projected November 15th completion date.
- The Power Department team has completed over 14 major residential / commercial and infrastructure installation improvements this fiscal year to date.
- Our Electric Superintendent has successfully been re-certified in Substation switching for MEAG operations.
- 92 work orders were completed this month. This is another record milestone.
- Our Power Department team have no reported mass outage calls for the moth of August.
- We wish to thank the citizens of Fairburn for their patience and understanding as we continue to replace, restore and renew our Electric Utility Infrastructure to meet their needs now and in the future.



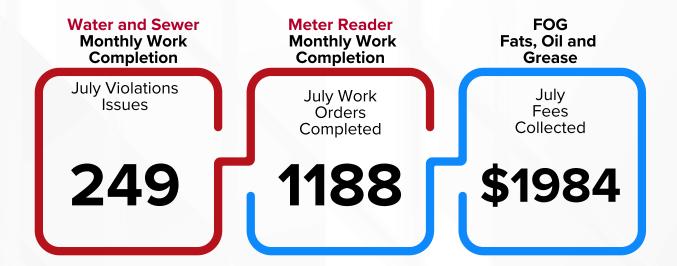
