The City of Fairburn recognizes the many contributions of Veterans whose acts of heroism protect the freedoms we enjoy as Americans. Originally called Armistice Day, November 11 has become the anniversary to commemorate the end of World War I. The name changed to Veteran's Day in 1954 to recognize the men and women who served in all wars.

Fairburn salutes our veterans for their military service and the community. According to census reports, Veterans account for 10.4% of Fairburn residents and another 20% of Fairburn's business owners.

Mayor Mario B. Avery and City Council will honor employees, who are also military Veterans, in an upcoming ceremony hosted by the City's Human Resources Department. There will also be special recognition to the family of Lt. Jean-Harold Astree, posthumously, who served as a valued member of the City of Fairburn's Police Department. "Veterans represent a valuable part of the Fairburn community, many who, following an extensive career in the military, answered the call to serve in public safety. We will forever be grateful for their contributions," stated Mayor Mario B. Avery.

"We appreciate the more than five years' service in Fairburn as a member of our police department's finest," stated City Administrator Tony M. Phillips. "Lt. Astree served in Fairburn and spent 29 years in the United States Air Force," Mr. Phillips added.

Fairburn's Placemaking Brings Smart City Kiosks, Public Art, & More







Cultivating a sense of place is fundamental to enhancing the City of Fairburn's downtown and neighborhoods citywide. As a part of the Creative Placemaking Strategic Plan, Art Advisory Council, Planning and Zoning, Community Development and Economic Development departments have worked closely with the Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC) to implement projects that enhance character spaces. Additionally, through funding mechanisms such as the Livable Cities Initiative (LCI), and National Endowment for the Arts (NEA), Fairburn continues to emerge as an arts and entertainment district within the South Fulton region.

Some of the recent additions are the installation of four creative crosswalk murals located at 1) Campbell Elementary School, 2) Duncan Park, 3) Landmark Christian School, and 4) Fairburn Youth Center. Additionally, to ensure community engagement regarding ongoing activities and governmental services, two new Smart City wayfinding kiosks were added within the downtown district. These solar powered panels offer realtime information regarding city services, list more than 50 restaurants and businesses, and provide daily updates regarding community events and more. Fairburn remains committed to activating public spaces to enhance the City's attractiveness and appeal, showcasing its diverse community, which is situated to succeed!
