Fairburn's Cora Robinson Park Re-Opens to a Renewed Look



Fairburn's Community Development Department has completed its upgrade of the Cora Robinson Park, which is set to reopen on October 18th in a ceremony to showcase new features and a community garden.

"Lightning is a treasured area of the city for continued investment. Investments like these bring a sense of safety and pride to our neighborhoods," commented Mayor Mario B. Avery.

Nestled in the northwest side of Fairburn's historic downtown Broad Street is the community of Lightning, a neighborhood of small cottage craftsman style homes and light commercial property that has been a focus of redevelopment. "Lightning offers a unique opportunity to enhance diverse housing options in a walkable distance from the downtown area, moreover it is a budding neighborhood for families, where renewed and continued investment make improvements such as the Cora Robinson Park key to sustainable development for the city," commented City Administrator Tony Phillips.

The park renewal stems from recommendations from the Lightning Community Strategic Plan, which is community based. "This project is a direct result of the Lightning Community Development Study and are Fulton County Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds at work" stated Lester Thompson, Community Development Department Director. The re-opening ceremony is open to the public and will be held from 5:30 pm – 7:30 pm in the Pedestrian Plaza across from Cora Robinson Park, located at 155 Dodd Street, Fairburn, GA 30213.



Creative Crosswalks & Mural Coming to Downtown Fairburn

Bringing public art to Fairburn's downtown is a part of the city's Strategic Placemaking Strategy to enhance the community's identity. Moreover, it is a critical element of Fairburn Focus 2023 to Refresh, Rebrand, and Renew. Creative Placemaking is fundamental to activating underutilized public and private spaces.

On September 12th Mayor Mario B. Avery and the City Council unanimously approved the Creative Crosswalk and Mural Project, which will continue to bring designs to our local streets and building to enhance the visual appeal. Fairburn's downtown Historic Commercial District has changed in the past few months. Beautification efforts to the Frankie Arnold Stage and Courtyard, the re-painting and activating the Underpass near the Freight Depot on SE Broad Street, a mural near Casablanca's Burger Joint, and now creative crosswalks throughout the city that will bring artist's designs to our streets and building. Fairburn Youth Center, Duncan Park, Campbell Elementary School, and Landmark Christian School are the new sites. Selected artists include Fairburn residents Nailah Smith and Rod Parker. And non-resident artist Jason Tetlak. Go Georgia Arts artist John Christian will paint the mural.

This year the City's Parks and Recreation and Human Resources Departments will partner to host a Breast Cancer Awareness Walk on October 28th from 9:00 AM – 11:00 AM.
