Sharing Our Voices: Fairburn's Downtown Selected for Phoenix Flies Historic Tours



The City of Fairburn joins the 2023 Phoenix Flies Tours. Fairburn is listed on the National Register of Historic Places for its downtown commercial district, which includes the Old Campbell County Courthouse, train and freight depots, a bank building, and shops dating back to the time of the City's original charter in 1854.

Phoenix Flies Tours is recognized by the Georgia Trust and Atlanta Preservation Society, which is "committed to advocacy and education of architecturally, historically, and culturally significant buildings, neighborhoods, and landscapes," as fundamental to showcasing communities of distinction. Over the years, Fairburn has experienced tremendous population growth, which is estimated to continue by 37% by 2040, according to research conducted in the recent 2021 LCI Downtown Master Plan Update. According to current Census data, Georgia ranks one of the 8th most populous states in America, and Fairburn is considered a top ten among Georgia cities for the fastest growth.

Fairburn's quality growth includes an increase in amenities, new businesses, infrastructure improvements, enhanced pedestrian-friendly spaces, retail, and restaurants. However, as Fairburn grows, the city remains mindful of the historical assets that have helped define its place in the region, a place in proximity to the area's best-in-class transportation and logistics infrastructure. 


