Fulton County Arts Council Awards Fairburn Grant for Downtown Public Art





The City of Fairburn has been awarded a grant by Fulton County Arts Council (FCAC) for public art. The 2023 Contracts for Services (CFS) Award is \$13,940 in funding to beautify a portion of the pedestrian underpass with mural designs, outdoor seating, and arts & entertainment. Creating a thriving and vibrant downtown is a vision shared by Fairburn leadership and residents alike.

Mixtures of uses, pedestrian friendly infrastructure, and green space are all a part of the City's creative placemaking, a strategy to promote connectivity while preserving historic elements. "We remain committed to increasing the amount of public investment into our downtown area. Through art we foster an environment to attract more businesses and visitors to our downtown district," stated Mayor Mario B. Avery.

Selection of the underpass project is a part of the City's ongoing efforts to revitalize downtown, with the hopes of attracting new retail such as coffee shops, restaurants, and fresh markets to increase options for residents and visitors. "Receiving funding from the Fulton County Council is important to our collaborative process with our county partners. We appreciate the support of the Fulton County Board of Commissioners and their efforts in helping ensure a vibrant arts community," explained Tony M. Phillips, City Administrator.

Community Corner: What you need to know?



Ordinances exist to ensure the public's health, safety, and welfare—for instance, pests. Parking on your lawn harms the grass and if grass is high, the surrounding area can become a haven for rodents, snakes, and other animals. Fairburn grass above six inches in height is a violation, if you live in an HOA community, the standards in your community covenants are likely stricter, but we do not enforce HOA covenants.

Listed below are a few common code violations:

- Parking and storage of vehicles in the front yard
- Junk vehicles (damaged, no tag, flat tires)
- Overgrown grass or weeds
- Trash, litter, and debris in the yard
- Commercial vehicles parked in residential areas
- Signs and banners with no permit issued
- Signs in the right-of-way
- Trash can/recycling bins remaining on the street
