# ADMINISTRATIVE UPDATE

The City of Fairburn understands the importance of quality utilities and strives to deliver exceptional service to our residents and customers. The electric rates have not changed since March 2012, and the water rates have not changed since October 2011 despite the costs of supplies, materials, operations, and maintenance & upkeep being greatly affected by inflation and supplychain issues. For example, our wholesale power costs increased 52% between 2012 and 2023. Similarly, water and sewer costs significantly increased during the same time frame.

## Adjusted Rate Schedule:

Electric: 8% overall revenue increase in 2024, followed by 6% in 2025 and 2026, then 3% each year between 2028 through 2033.

Water and Sewer: 5% overall revenue increase each year in 2024, 2025 and 2026.

The City is committed to transparent and responsible rate management. These carefully considered utility rate adjustments, the first in over a decade, are essential to provide adequate financial resources to maintain quality of service and reinvest in aging system infrastructure. To ensure financial sustainability and service excellence, these rates will be reviewed regularly and may be adjusted to reflect changing costs and infrastructure as needed.

Though individual properties and accounts may have different outcomes based on usage, the impact of these rate increases should average between 10% and 11% for most homeowners. The new rates appeared on the February 2024 utility statement. The increased rates remain competitive, and our commitment to exceptional service remains unchanged. Additionally, our Utilities Team is working closely with the billing system vendor, to correct the service dates that are presented on all utility bills. The "service/read dates" are the days that are included in each billing cycle. These are the days that reflect the readings that were captured, electronically or manual, during our monthly billing process. According to our billing system provider, the "book dates" reflects a 30-day period within each month. Currently, all billing statements are showing the "book dates" instead of the actual "service/read dates".

Therefore, your next invoice will not reflect the actual service days within the current billing cycle. The invoice will show the next 30-day period as 12/31/2023 through 1/30/2024. However, the actual service days will be 1/17/2024 – 2/13/2024.

Please be assured that we are working diligently to get these changes updated as quickly and efficiently as possible. We apologize for any inconveniences this may cause, but we thank you for your understanding and continued patience during this time.
