Fix a Leak Week



Leaks Can Run, but They Can't Hide

Are you ready to chase down leaks? Household leaks can waste nearly 1 trillion gallons of water annually nationwide, so each year we hunt down the drips during Fix a Leak Week, Mark your calendars for EPA's annual Fix a Leak Week, March 18 through 24, 2019—but remember that you can find and fix leaks inside and outside your home to save valuable water and money all year long

Do you know where your energy dollars go?

When you see the charge for energy, do you have any idea what all is involved? According to a study by the U.S. Department of Energy, it typically breaks out as follows:

- 3% Refrigerators: If you have an old refrigerator out in the carport or garage, dispose of it properly.
- 44% Space Heating: Change filters regularly and have the unit serviced annually to keep it in top performance.
- 25% Lighting, Electronics and Appliances: Switch to LED bulbs, turn off lights and appliances when not in use and only run the dishwasher and washer/dryer with full loads.
- 19% Water Heating: Set the thermostat to 120 degrees and fix water leaks.
- 9% Air Conditioning: Have the HVAC system serviced annually and replace filters according to the manufacturer's instructions.


