FAIRBURN: SITUATED TO SUCCEED

Greetings:

On Monday, March 4, 2019, a 30-inch water transmission pipe in the City of Atlanta ruptured causing a major water outage in the Cities of Fairburn, Union City, Chattahoochee Hills and South Fulton. Due to low or no water pressure, nearly 25 Fulton County Schools and over 100,000 people and businesses underwent a boil-water advisory. Fairburn received numerous phone calls and messages from concerned residents inquiring about the outage. We attempted to keep you informed by Robo-calls, Fairburn Website and all our social media outlets, including "Notify Me" on our Fairburn Webpage. Please be advised that the City of Fairburn did everything within our powers to work with the City of Atlanta to help resolve the problem expeditiously.

The Cities of Fairburn, Union City and Palmetto have been actively engaged in securing its own water reservoir to supply our cities water needs through the establishment of the South Fulton Municipal Water Authority. I will be providing you with good news on this project in the next Fairburn Newsletter.

On behalf of the Fairburn City Council and myself, we would like to extend our sincere apologies to those residents and businesses who were affected by the city-wide water outage. Thank you for your patience and understanding during this chaotic time.

Attendees represented cities with populations ranging from 92 citizens to more than 200,000 citizens. Sessions at the annual conference included information about switching from campaigning to governing, legal policies, ethics, available resources, staff relations, land use issues, municipal financial policies, and successful meeting management.
