The Fulton County Board

The Fulton County Board of Commissioners approved on September 16, 2020 to increase the amount of the Municipal Expenditures Reimbursement Program (CARES Act) funding from \$2.5m to \$25m and \$5m of PPEs supply to all fourteen cities in the County. The allocation available to each city is determined using the ratio of the population of each city, less the City of Atlanta. The City of Fairburn's share of the funding is: \$699,575. These

funds must be expended by December 15, 2020. The Council and I will be working diligently to use this funding in the most appropriate manner that will benefit the entire City of Fairburn.

As we enter the fall and winter flu season, I ask each of you to remain vigilant of COVID-19 as we continue to fight this deadly virus.
